Current Campus Policies

Mr. David Friedman, our Facilities Manager is the designated security officer. In case of serious crime in progress, unauthorized intrusion, or any other emergency - call 911. This number can be reached from any pay phone without depositing money or from any of the College extension phones (even those that cannot dial outside lines). [IMPORTANT NOTE: Please do not test this system. Once 911 is called the calling number and address are displayed on their screen and if you don't talk or if you hang up a police car will be dispatched to ascertain that everything is in order.]

Should there be a situation that requires a timely warning, a message will be sent out via text and/or robocalls to all students and/or staff apprising them of the current situation. These decisions will be made by the school administration on a case-by-case basis. This system will also be used to make timely warning reports to members of the campus community about crimes that have occurred on campus and require timely reporting.

Ner Israel is committed a safe and healthy campus. Confidential reports may be made to any of the above individuals as well. With your permission, a report will be drawn up with the details of the incident without revealing your identity. The purpose of a confidential report is to comply with your wish to keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to ensure the future safety of yourself and others. If any student or staff would like to anonymously or confidentially report a crime (either as a victim or as a witness) they can call or email a report, anonymous calls and emails are accepted. Additionally, one can write up the report and leave it in the administration building.

Annually all statistics will be complied by the financial aid office and then submitted to the Department of Education. Afterwards they will be added to the annual report and posted to the College's website.

Campus Facilities

Different buildings on our campus have different security needs and setups. Access to all school facilities is restricted to students, employees and authorized visitors who are approved by the school administration. Only students and staff are allowed in the dormitories at any time. Visitors are allowed in the study hall but are encouraged to check in by the administrative offices first. Our gates are closed at night and are manned by an unarmed security guard who checks each visitor and confirms that it should be safe to enter. The College's policy is that all residential facility exterior doors are automatically locked. All students are given the keys to their dorm. All maintenance staff working in the dormitory areas are expected to lock the dormitory room doors and exterior doors after they have completed their work. Our dormitories are controlled by keycard access control and/or security locks. Most of our other buildings are under CCTV. Additionally there are camera and license plate readers at each entrance to the campus. The video is stored for a minimum of 4 weeks to be able to roll back the information should it be needed for security purposes.

Local Law Enforcement

Ner Israel has a working relationship with the Baltimore County Police Department. We are located in Precinct 4. They are located at 15 Milford Mill Road, Baltimore, Maryland 21208. Their phone number is: 410-887-1279 and their fax: 410-887-6770. The Commanding Officer is Captain Andrea Bylen. No employee of Ner Israel is authorized to make any arrests. Ner Israel does not have any written agreements with any local law enforcement. Ner Israel will report any crimes that require a police report and will encourage and assist anyone that needs to do so. Pastoral counselors on campus, if and when they deem appropriate, will inform persons that they can report crimes on a voluntary and confidential basis. Should any of our students be involved in a crime, even at an off-campus location, the police will inform us of the actions that we are required to take.

Programs

Annually all students are informed by the Head dorm counselor of the various security precautions taken by the college. Additionally, this discussion will cover other topics regarding Title IX domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking. Drug and alcohol abuse is also address in this forum. Employees are also provided with this information. All students and staff have constant access to all our security and emergency procedures and are expected to review this material. This discussion also deals with crime prevention, and how not to make yourself a victim of a crime.

Alcohol & Illegal Drugs

All students are informed at the beginning of the year that all state underage drinking laws will be enforced. Additionally, there is no tolerance for any illegal drug use.

Title IX

Policy regarding Title IX - domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking:

Sec. 1: Policy statement: The College is fully committed to maintaining a safe and secure environment for all students and employees, and maintaining an environment where all students are granted equal access to education based on the federal Title IX of the Education

Amendments of 1972, and subsequent revisions. The latest regulatory update was published as a Final Rule in the Federal Register on 5/19/2020 is effective on August 14, 2020. Accordingly, the school adheres to a strict no-tolerance policy to prevent physical or emotional attacks or offenses of any type; including dating violence, domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking, as well as harassment, or intimidation in any type or form. Sexual harassment, including sexual assault, dating violence, domestic violence, and stalking, is unlawful discrimination on the basis of sex. The College's policy is to promptly and effectively respond to any incident of sexual violence or sexual misconduct in accordance with the Title IX Final Rule. Domestic Violence is defined as the occurrence of one or more of the following criminal offenses upon a person protected under the Prevention of Domestic Violence Act of 1990: Homicide, Assault, Terroristic threats, Kidnapping, Criminal Restraint, False Imprisonment, Sexual Assault, Criminal Sexual Contact, Lewdness, Criminal Mischief, Burglary, Criminal Trespass, Harassment, Stalking.

The College takes as a serious responsibility its obligation to address all incidents of sexual misconduct, violence and offensive or inappropriate demeanor that take place in the school's educational program or activity. Behaviors under the following three categories will be addressed in this policy:

- Quid pro quo harassment by a school's employee
- Unwelcome conduct that a reasonable person would find so severe, pervasive, and objectively offensive that it denies a person equal educational access
- Instance of sexual assault (as defined in the Clery Act), including dating violence, domestic violence, or stalking as defined in the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA)

The College has designated Boruch Neuberger, President as the Title IX coordinator. As Coordinator, Rabbi Neuberger will be responsible to ensure that the formal complaint and grievance process is carried out in accordance with the protocol set forth in this policy. A key principle throughout this policy is to ensure the safety and privacy of all parties. Any student who is the victim of sexual misconduct or any person, employee, or student who has witnessed sexual misconduct may report the incident to the Title IX Coordinator. All students, faculty and staff as well as applicants for admission and employment are formally notified below of the Title IX Coordinator's name and contact information, which is also available on https://nirc.edu/wp-content/uploads/2020/08/Title-IX.pdf

Sec. 2: Education programs to promote awareness and prevention: The College offers a primary prevention and awareness program to all incoming students, students, and new and current employees, including faculty. Staff members are available to provide this program on an on-

going basis as needed. The program includes: 1. An in-person discussion covering the topics for new students. For employees each division head does the in-person discussion with them. 2. Lectures on dating and related issues for students are held periodically throughout the semester. Times are posted in College in advance of the lecture. 3. The College's comprehensive sholom bayis and chassanim program. Should one become a chosson, please reach out to Rabbi Tzvi Krakauer at 443-257-3572. 4. One-on-one consultations concerning marriage and sholom bayis are available to all students and employees with both Rabbi Krakauer and Rabbi Shrago Neuberger 410-409-1878.

Sec. 3: Procedures the College will follow: In the case of a reported alleged offense or attack as described above in Sec. 1, the institution reserves the right to request that the alleged attacker leave the institution until such time as a disciplinary hearing can take place. The disciplinary hearing is described in Sec. 6 below, and will be based on the clear and convincing standard of evidence.

Sec. 4: Possible sanctions and protective measures: Any student found by a College disciplinary committee to have committed one of these offenses will be subject to disciplinary action, often including expulsion from the campus. The College is committed to a safe campus environment and will make alternative academic, living, transportation and/or working accommodations if requested by the victim, and if such accommodations are reasonably available, regardless of whether the victim chooses to report the crime to campus disciplinary committees and/or local law enforcement. In the event that a victim obtains an order of protection, no contact order, restraining order, or similar lawful order against another student or employee, the College will work with the victim to arrange accommodations in academic and housing arrangements as necessary.

Sec. 5: Procedures victims should follow: In the event of an incident or assault under this policy, caution should be exercised so as not to impede the preservation and collection of evidence, which may be necessary as proof of a criminal offense and/or obtaining protective orders. It should be noted that time is a critical factor with regard to accurate evidence collection, so prompt reporting to police is advised. If you are aware of an attack in progress, please contact the authorities immediately by calling 911 and notify Rabbi Boruch Neuberger or David Friedman. The nearest police station is located 15 Milford Mill Road, Baltimore, Maryland 21208 and their phone number is: 410-887-1279. Victims should report an attack to the police and either Rabbi Boruch Neuberger or David Friedman, at the contact information provided above. If a student does not feel comfortable contacting the police directly, or would like the assistance of the College's staff in contacting the police, he should call either Rabbi Boruch Neuberger or David Friedman. Victims of a crime have the right to refrain from reporting to the police. If a student makes that choice, their other rights under this policy and the Clery Act will still be protected. Either Rabbi Boruch Neuberger or David Friedman can be contacted in confidence for any necessary arrangements and assistance with any civil protections. In the event that a victim obtains an order of protection, no contact order, restraining order, or similar lawful order against another student or employee, the College will work with the victim to arrange accommodations in academic and housing arrangements as necessary. If a student or employee reports a crime, their rights under this policy and the Clery Act will be provided in writing.

Sec. 6: Procedures for Disciplinary Proceedings: To begin proceedings, a formal complaint must be filed in writing with the Title IX Officer. Once a formal complaint has been filed, an investigation of the allegation will be initiated by a disciplinary committee whose members receive annual training on issues related to domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking and how to conduct an investigation and hearing process that protects the safety of victims and promotes accountability. Any person on the disciplinary committee must be free from conflict of interest. The committee will send the parties, and their advisors, a summary of the evidence directly related to the allegations, in electronic format or hard copy, with at least 10 days for the parties to inspect, review, and respond to the evidence before a formal hearing. The committee will provide a prompt, fair and impartial hearing. A transcript or recording of any live hearing will be made available. This hearing is not a replacement for any action taken by various external authorities. The hearing may take place in person or via a virtual meeting such as Zoom videoconference or similar. The accuser and the accused are each entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during the disciplinary proceeding, including the opportunity to be accompanied to any related meeting or proceeding by the advisor of their choice. Both parties as well as any witnesses will be interviewed in order to make a determination of the student's culpability. The standard of evidence employed for these proceedings will be the clear and convincing standard of evidence. The accuser and the accused will be informed simultaneously, in writing, of the outcome of the disciplinary proceeding, up to and including immediate expulsion of the offender from the institution. The accuser and accused will also be informed simultaneously, in writing, of the institution's procedures for the accuser and the accused to appeal the results of the institutional disciplinary proceeding; any change to the results that occurs prior to the time that such results become final; and when such results become final.

Sec. 7: Protecting victim confidentiality: The proceedings of the disciplinary committee are not considered public records. In the event that any record of a report of domestic violence, etc. must be made available to members of the public, the names of victims and any identifying information would be redacted to the extent permissible by law. Names and identifying information of victims will not be included in any publicly available report of a crime or complaint made to the College.

Sec. 8: Available services for victims: Confidential counseling for victims is available only through off site campus services, such as: Relief Resources located at 5906 Park Heights Ave suite 107-6 in Baltimore, MD 21215, 410-448-8356, yslansky@reliefhelp.org. Victims may also contact the Shalom Task Force's Confidential Hotline at (718) 337-3700 for victim advocacy options and legal assistance.

Sec. 9: Accommodations to students: The College is committed to a safe campus environment and will make alternative academic, living, transportation and/or working accommodations if requested by the victim, and if such accommodations are reasonably available, regardless of whether the victim chooses to report the crime to campus disciplinary committees and/or local law enforcement. In the event that a victim obtains an order of protection, no contact order, restraining order, or similar lawful order against another student or employee, the College will work with the victim to arrange accommodations in academic and housing arrangements as necessary.

Sec. 10: Employee Policy: Any employee with a complaint regarding sexual harassment, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault and stalking sexual harassment, should immediately contact the Department of Human Resources. Any supervisor or manager who becomes aware of conduct or an allegation of harassment, discrimination or retaliation, must contact the Department of Human Resources immediately. The Department of Human Resources will be responsible for investigating the complaint.

Sec. 11: Written Explanation: Any student or employee who reports to the College that the student or employee has been a victim of domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, or stalking, whether the offense occurred on or off campus will be provided with the above written explanation of the College's policy and the student or employee's rights and options.

Sec. 12: Registered Offenders List: In accordance with the CSCP Act of 2000, institutions of higher education are required to advise the campus community where they can obtain a list of registered offenders provided by the State. It also requires offenders to provide notice of each institution of higher education in that State at which the person is employed, carries a vocation, or is a student. 
